

## **Reinforcement worksheet I**

• Pupils look at the pictures and read the clues to complete the crossword.

Key: Across: 1 leaf, 2 river, 3 plant. Down: 3 picnic, 4 lake, 5 grass, 6 forest, 7 field.

• **Optional follow-up activity:** Pupils think of one more word to add to the crossword and write the clue for their partner to solve.

### **Reinforcement worksheet 2**

- Pupils use a dice or the spinner from page 39 to move up and down the statements and questions for the punctuation marks. With the first throw/spin, they land on an exclamation and with the second, a suggestion. They then write the sentences on the lines below. If the two make sense together, they write Yes, *please*. and if not, *No*, *thank you*.
- **Optional follow-up activity:** Pupils work in groups of four. One pupil makes a statement about a problem. The first pupil to offer a sensible suggestion has the next go.

### **Extension worksheet I**

- Pupils look at the picture and label the places forest, river, lake or field. They then read the text and transfer the information to the chart (by putting ticks and crosses). They then work out the name of each of the characters.
- Key: painting Peter, with sheep Vicky, fishing from boat – Jill, in forest with dog – Mary, fishing in river – Bill.
- Optional follow-up activity: Pupils work in groups of four. One pupil describes the likes and dislikes of one of the characters (changing the order of activities in the chart, for example, She likes painting. She doesn't like water. She likes animals but she doesn't like fishing.). The first pupil to guess which character it is has the next go.

### **Extension worksheet 2**

• This can be done as a listening exercise (Track 14) or a reading exercise. Pupils decide which sentence goes in each gap and then write the numbers in the boxes.

Key: See Pupil's Book, page 59.

• **Optional follow-up activity:** Pupils work in groups of four. Together they decide on four of the story frames and each pupil then cuts out these four frames. They then shuffle all the cards together and deal them out equally. They say 1, 2, 3, pass! then discard one card face down in front of the player on their left. Each player picks up the new card and decides which card to discard next. The winner is the first player to end up with four cards the same.

#### Song worksheet

• Pupils listen to the song (Track 15) and identify the pictograms. They then write each missing word on the dotted line.

Key: See Pupil's Book, page 57.

• Optional follow-up activity: Pupils write a short text about themselves using five pictograms. Pupils work in pairs, A and B. They swap texts. Pupil A reads Pupil B's text and vice versa. To do so, they will need to interpret the pictograms.


### **Topic worksheet**


- Pre-teach words you think the pupils may find difficult. Pupils write the parts of the plant. Next they read the sentences and match them with the pictures.

Key: 1 b, 2 i, 3 f, 4 c, 5 g, 6 h, 7 d, 8 j, 9 e, 10 a


• **Optional follow-up activity:** Help your pupils understand the dimensions by asking them, for example, to stand in a circle with a diameter of three metres or mark the length of the leaves, roots and trees on the playground floor. Time how long it takes them to walk, jump, run, etc the same length.







